Want a healthy pet? Feed a GOOD FOOD!

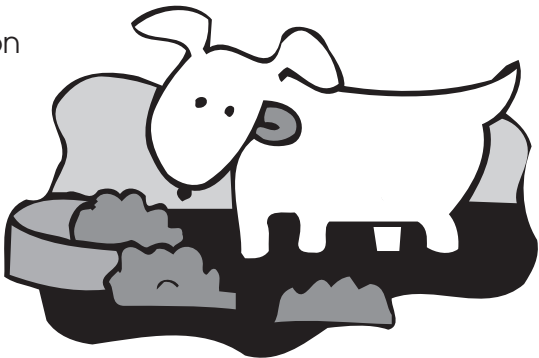

Feed the best food you can afford to feed. Cheap foods have inferior ingredients, poor quality control, are not as digestible, and may contain excesses or deficiencies of various nutrients. The better the food, the more digestible it is, so the less you have to feed.

Sometimes more expensive brands are actually cheaper to use because you feed less. You may need to feed three times as much of a poor quality food to get the same amount of nutrition. Also remember that most of a pet's diet should be dry food, not canned. Canned food is more expensive, leads to dental problems, and isn't necessary to keep your pet happy.

There is a lot of research that goes into a good brand of dog or cat food. We are still learning about the nutritional needs of our companion animals, and only the companies that are keeping up with the latest findings have incorporated them into their foods.

The following recommendations are our personal opinions, based on the reputation of the company, the level of its research and quality control, and the associations we have read about or seen between certain foods and nutritionally related diseases. Remember, there is a big difference between adequate nutrition and optimum nutrition.
